Our Mission:

- ♦ **The mission** of the San Gabriel Valley Habitat for Humanity (SGVHFH) Youth Program is to **empower** local students. We aim to partner with students, to actively **engage and ignite** a **new generation of leaders** that are dedicated to the cause, to **eliminate poverty housing** and to **be the change** our world desperately needs.

Why participate?

- ♦ **It will benefit your community and another family in the need of housing:** Habitat for Humanity builds can unify diverse racial, political, sectarian and ethnic groups, and build lasting relationships that strengthen individuals and communities. Thanks to the youth, another family in your community will enjoy the blessings of a simple, decent home.

Target Goal for SGVHFH 2011:

- ♦ **Commit** to help provide **5** families with homes with the upcoming Geneva Build. If you and your group reach your groups giving goal, your team will have designated Saturday shift to build! (Up to 20 people)

Ways to Get Involved:

- ♦ **Join Youth United:** Be a member of our San Gabriel Leadership Team. You will plan, organize, dream, lead and excite others about the mission of Habitat.
- ♦ **Start a Campus Club:** A Campus Club is a student-led organization on a high school or college campus that partners with advisors, teachers, and the local Habitat affiliate to fulfill these four functions: **Build, Fundraise, Educate, Advocate.**
- ♦ **Geneva Build May 2011:** Volunteer to help us build **5** houses for families in need. When the target amount of funds are raised the process begins. *Raise the target goal and have a specific build day for your specific group.*
- ♦ **Shantytown Fundraising Event** Students build small shelters out of cardboard boxes/other materials in a public space to simulate a neighborhood with poverty housing. They have a sleep out in those houses, using the “town” as a symbol to educate others about low-income housing.
- ♦ **Habitat Awakening Tour: Fall 2011:** Get your entire school excited about Habitat! Have our Student Movement come to a school assembly, chapel or luncheon to show our relevant short films and local documentaries on poverty housing.
